Josh Reno is a sociocultural anthropologist, primarily interested in the intersections between environmental issues and science and technology. He conducted his doctoral fieldwork on transnational waste circulation and mega-landfills in North America. His dissertation explores the political economy of waste circulation, its transformation of landscapes, lives and communities in rural Michigan, and its relationship to environmental politics and neoliberalism. From 2008-2010 he conducted fieldwork in the UK, studying emerging European technologies in the fields of health and the environment, their innovation, contestation and governance. He has authored articles on the environment, science and technology, language and communication, and material culture and is the co-editor, with Catherine Alexander, of *Recycling Economies*, expected in 2012 from Zed Books. He trained in anthropology at the University of Michigan, where he received his PhD in 2008.
