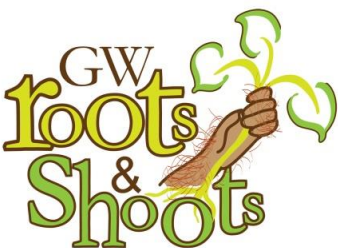
Tremaine Gregory
